

The Elephant Rock Property

Over 100 years ago, our founder of Palmer Lake, Dr Thompson, wanted to promote "the beautiful region which lay to the west of the lake as a place for a health resort and a vacation community."

I would love to see his dream continue by revitalizing the recently acquired Elephant Rock property, to create an eco-tourist attraction, without destroying the integrity of the existing micro-resort, achieved by renovating, updating and adding to the buildings and trails.

By recapturing the essence of the pioneer spirit, we could create a more lucrative an attraction as those found in the surrounding towns of Larkspur, Colorado Springs and Woodland Park with their Rennaissance Fair, Flying W Ranch and The North Pole.

The plan;

A cohesive Old West "pioneer" village designed to provide an opportunity for whole families to reconnect with nature and each

other. With an emphasis on the arts, science, sports, education, health, and entertainment with multi-use pavilions, arenas, dining hall, a spa (for which I already have a unique recycled-water design) on the site of the abandoned swimming pool.

The old amphitheater would be an easy low-budget fix,

a venue for music, nature talks and star-gazing, as would expanding the trails for snow-shoeing, hiking and of course horse-riding.....stables? 4 H programs? chuck-wagon suppers?

An event center, utilizing the existing central buildings, housing, retail and town administration offices, would support all of the above, whilst catering could be provided by the various local restaurants.

Funding;

Each venue would be offered to private investors who would be responsible for the building costs and management of their business, whose design would be in keeping with the unifying theme. Dr. Thompson himself proposed to "furnish the land free of cost if (they) would build the general store and manage it. "

A committee could be formed to investigate all available grants.

Sponsorship from theme related, major retail companies, could occupy and run stores within the central building.

Wrangler, Stetson, Ariat are all current sponsors at the Flying W Ranch. We could also procure local businesses that are a fit.

The existing trails could be improved by linking up with Monument creek utilizing the micro-environment and creating a bridge across to Laughing Water Drive on into our National Forest trails.

The possibilities are endless, we have already approached several potential investors in the specific fields of Entertainment, Hospitality, Retail and Restaurants all who showed great interest.

Possible Options to consider

- 1. Lease to own after the ten year period.
- 2. Lease Free whilst investors renovate and/or build.
- 3. Create a partnership with investors to bear responsibility for all common areas.
- 4. Subdivide designate fifty one percent of property to the town of Palmer Lake by subdivision

- 1. The Palmer Lake Brewery at the Warehouse, downtown Colorado Springs... we redesigned and built the brewery, bottling facility, apartments, penthouse and art gallery.
- 2. The SunWater Spa in Manitou Springs (\$2.5 million project) We designed (in close collaboration with Fisher Architects) and built the spa complex.

The process took three years as we had to work with both the City of Manitou Springs and their Historical Society.

3. Otates Water Project

Born and educated in England, Lindsay Ray earned her degree in Theatre Design at the Central School of Art in London.


