The Parks and Trails Commission in collaboration with the USAFA engineering Cadets, have designed, built, and installed the first of three bridges, allowing creek side crossing and access to the Elephant Rock property. The vision of Parks and Trails is coming to fruition. The Board of Trustees recently held a joint workshop with the Planning Commission and the Parks and Trails Commission to brainstorm a collaborative approach to planning the Elephant Rock property. This advisory committee will be led by Planning Commission member Susan Miner and will include two members of Parks, Planning and Board of Trustees along with several citizens.
