



**PALMER LAKE, COLORADO
ORDINANCE NO. 6 OF 1998**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1 OF ORDINANCE 1 OF 1979, ELIMINATING A \$25 WATER SERVICE DEPOSIT.

WHEREAS, THE TOWN OF PALMER LAKE HAS DETERMINED THAT IT NO LONGER HAS NEED OF THE \$25 WATER DEPOSIT AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE DIRECTION OF THE BOARD HAS DETERMINED TO ELIMINATE SUCH;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF PALMER LAKE, EL PASO COUNTY, COLORADO, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Ordinance 1 of 1979 and § 13.01.030 of the Palmer Lake Municipal Code are amended to read as follows:

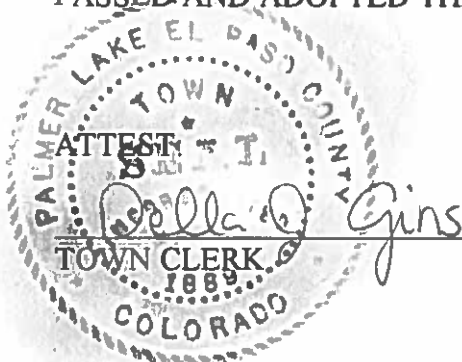
13.01.030 Receipts and Deposits. The Town Clerk shall keep a correct account of all receipts, make out all bills for the same, and deposit the proceeds so collected with the Town Treasurer to the credit of the water works funds of the Town, and in accordance with the direction of the Board.


Section 2. Any water service deposits shall be applied as a credit on the April water bills for those utilizers having water deposits with the Town, who are still receiving water service. For those utilizers, who do not have water deposits with the Town and who are no longer receiving water service, the Town will refund their deposit by mailing same to the last known address.

Section 2. Severability. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Palmer Lake, Colorado that the sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance are severable, and if any sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by the valid judgment or decree of Court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining sentences, clauses or phrases of this ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the Board of Trustees without the incorporation of any unconstitutional or invalid sentence, clause or phrase.

Section 3. Publication. The Town Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance and cause notice of its contents and passage to be published or posted. This ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after the date of publication.
